Action**033.15 RAF Shawbury**

Mike Cauchi from RAF Shawbury updated the meeting on two developments being considered in Shawbury. The first is a housing estate opposite the camp between the St Mary's Primary School site and Millbrook. The second is a sports field development opposite RAPRA. Although both applications had now been approved by Shropshire Council the station did object to the applications on the grounds that new residents unfamiliar with the noise generated by an active RAF station might generate an undue level of complaints – any future complaints from this new site will be directed to SC directly.

The station is launching a campaign to encourage horse riders to wear high visibility jackets so that over-flying aircraft can see them better and take the necessary action. Further details are available on their website and through Facebook.

A new Station Commander will take up his post within the next few months.

034.15 Highway Matters

The Parish Clerk reported on the responses received from Victoria Doran, Shropshire Council's Highways Manager, on all outstanding highway issues, highlighted below in blue.

Highway Log ref: H/02/01 - Update required on the flooding on the High Hatton Road following a site meeting with Claire Wilson, Shropshire Council's Drainage Technician and Cllr's Simon Chapple, Derek Fildes and Chas Warren.

Funding for this has unfortunately been withdrawn. Work has been programmed for the ditches to be cleaned out and signs to be erected.

Further action proposed: Shropshire Council to contact Ben Linnington who had offered to dig an extra trench in the area if Shropshire Council supply and install the pipework.

Highway Log ref: H/02/02 - Update required following a meeting between your local technician and Cllr Derek Fildes regarding his concerns over roadside drainage issues by Stone House Farm.

A job will be raised and programmed to install a new gully

Highway Log ref: H/02/03 - Update required with reference to the blocked gully at the junction to the A53 at Yew Tree Villa.

The gully has been jetted both by a private contractor on behalf of the PC and also SC.

Further action proposed: Despite the above flooding still occurs suggesting that the soakaway needs revising completely.

Highway Log ref: H/02/04 - Update required after we had expressed concern that urgent attention was still required around the last left hand bend before the bridge in Stanton from Moreton Corbet direction. The edge of the road surface was breaking up badly forcing vehicles into the centre of the road. Now getting worse.

The safety defects have been addressed. We will look to include the area in our patching programme later in the year, if costs allow.

Highway Log ref: H/02/05 - Although the parish council supported an extension to The Hazels Poultry Farm, following our concerns that the majority of HGV's going to this site off the A53 are using the narrow single track road past Manning's Farm, Shropshire Council agreed to our request that 'Unsuitable for HGV's' signs are erected at either end of this road. **Update required.**

The signs have been ordered. Once delivered, Ringway will install.

Highway Log ref: H/02/06 - Update required following our concern over the speed of traffic coming out of Stanton village and going down Harcourt Mill Lane, especially at night. The road signs as you approach this lane from Stanton are very confusing along with a lack of clear road markings and we requested that the national speed limit signs need removing or repositioning and white lining improved.

The traffic engineer has inspected but requires clarification of what exactly the issues are regarding the confusing road signs and lack of clear road markings. He could not identify any problems. If the speed limit signs were to be relocated, this would require changing the speed limit order and would therefore need to go through legal process of consultation, etc. It would also be subject to available funding and prioritisation.

Further action proposed: Site meeting to be arranged with Chairman to clarify the issues at this junction.

Highway Log ref: H/02/07 - In response to your email about the Harcourt Mill Lane, you are aware the road is designated as 'unsuitable for vehicles'. However, you stated that they will fill what they can along the tarmacked sections. **Update required.**

The technician will inspect and arrange for any safety defects to be repaired.

Highway Log ref: H/02/08 - As regards Harcourt Mill Lane and our request to improve its poor condition, we understand that Shropshire Council have contracted for repairs to the small lane opposite the ruins

to deal with extensive potholes. This work has been delayed to the annoyance of highways by the contractor. When they do get around to doing it, they will remove some Tarmac from around the holes & need to dispose of it (at some cost to the contractor). There are two flooded sections of Harcourt Mill Lane currently where the road surface has been eroded so much that they are low & flood to the full road width repeatedly. Can we suggest the contractor is asked to dump the spoil & compact it into these low spots? It can only help, whilst not costing anything. **Comments required.**

The local technician will liaise with Mouchel (who are managing this work) and see if it is possible.

Additional Highway Issues

Cllr Claire Crackett reported deep pot holes between the edge of the village and Glebe House.

The Chairman reported that the double white lines need repainting on the A53 heading south as you come over the brow of the hill just before the Stanton/Peplow crossroads.

Speed Limits

Cllr Chas Warren reported on recent correspondence he had had with the Rt Hon Owen Paterson MP over recent Government funding for a variety of initiatives which help to create safe walking environments. One being to implement 20 mph limits and zones. After some discussion Members felt that further information was required regarding the criteria for 20 mph zones as we did not want any more road markings and signs in the village. Shropshire Council would also be contacted to see if they provide funding for such a scheme.

Cllr Chas Warren reported that following a site meeting with officers from Shropshire Council over a locked gate on the byway from Hopton Chapel to the shooting ground road. Evidence is now being collected to prove that this Right of Way has been used in the past. Cllr Chas Warren agreed to contact the relevant land owners. If no progress was forthcoming then the Chairman agreed to put these concerns in writing.
