Well, as you can imagine, nobody really knows for sure, but legend has associated King Arthur with the Bury Walls since at least the late 16th or early 17th century. Bury Walls is an ancient hill fort, and scheduled monument right on the parish boundary at Weston-under-Redcastle, just to the West of the Hawkstone Scramble Track and West Midland Shooting Grounds sites.



Bury Walls is what's known as a Large multivallate hill fort, occupying a well-defined promontory of the Southern facing escarpment of the imposing sandstone ridge that edges the parish northern boundary. The fort is in the order of 380m East-West by 520m North-South and its defensive circuit, encompassing a natural spring, encloses an area of about 8 hectares,

more than enough for a very large community.

The defensive strength of the hill fort is based on the surrounding ground sloping steeply in all directions except to the North. Much of what's left of the fort consists of a single, but sizeable, rampart, which is defined on its Northern side by a ditch, an outer rampart and an

external ditch. From within the interior, the height of the rampart varies considerably from 1.8m to 7.8m. The principal entrance to the fort is near the North-East corner, where the ends of the inner rampart turn inwards to form an entrance passage about 5m wide. Lancelot and the Knights of the Round Table could have easily passed through!

2015 GENERAL ELECTION FACTS

SHARE OF THE VOTE

9.3 m voted out of a possible 12.2 m. Tories won 36.9% (up 0.8) Labour won 30.4% (up 1.5). UKIP won 12.6%, Lib Dems won 7.9% (down 15.1) SNP won 4.7% (up 3.1) Greens won 3.8% (up 2.8).

SHARE OF THE SEATS

It took 3.9m votes to deliver UKIP's single MP, it took 1.2m votes to deliver one Green MP, it took 300,000 votes to deliver a Lib Dem MP, by contrast it took 40,000 votes to deliver a Labour MP and 34,000 to deliver a Conservative MP and just 26,000 for each SNP MP.

THE NEW PARLIAMENT

187 out of the 650 MPs are now women, (29% up from 23% in 2010). There are 41 ethnic minority MPs. 32% of MPs are privately educated, there are 32 lesbian and gay MPs.

The swing from Labour to SNP in Glasgow NE was 39.28% the largest in UK history. 20 year old SNP Mhairi Black is the youngest MP since the reform act of 1832.
